

Man Arrested for Burglaries in Eight Counties, 14 Solved in Macon

Tony Beasley, age 49, of Trousdale County, was recently arrested by Sumner County authorities during a home burglary in progress, at which time he admitted to crimes in Trousdale, Smith, Jackson, Clay, Putnam, Wilson, Sumner and Macon counties.

According to Macon County Sheriff's Department Detective Darrell Taylor, Beasley's arrest has already solved 14 cases of burglary, aggravated burglary and theft of property in Macon County alone.

Among the numerous items Beasley has accumulated from his thefts in Macon County are guns, prescription drugs, lawn mowers, power tools, scrap iron, televisions, CB radios, gaming consoles and jewelry.

While many of the items have been returned to owners, detectives have compiled photos of stolen jewelry and need your help in identifying the owners.
