As its popularity grew, so did the Chronicle size and staff, and the weekly paper moved to a more centralized location in Lafayette so to better suit the needs of the county and its expanding readership, in 2005.

Adding the first splash of color to its pages in August of 2005, The Chronicle has quadrupled in size since its first 8-page edition in '93 and has been titled 'Macon County's fastest growing' and 'largest circulating' newspaper.

Published every Tuesday, the Chronicle is Macon County's only locally owned news source and is committed to providing the most accurate, up-to-date information and coverage of local events in the area.

First established by the late Jim Durham of Red Boiling Springs, The Chronicle was eventually bought in the fall of 2010 by Marcus R. Darnell, owner of Macon Publishing.

The winner of numerous Tennessee Press Awards for its coverage, visual quality and writing, the Chronicle continues to add to its accomplishments and is a proud member of the Tennessee Press Association.
