The psalmist didn't say, "Blessed is the nation whose God is money." Neither did he say, "Blessed is the nation whose God is pleasure." And he didn't say, in order to be politically correct in generations yet unborn, "Blessed is the nation whose God is Allah." No, he said, and I believe it, "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord."

So will America be blessed and survive? She will if God is her Lord. In the full Biblical context to this passage, that nation is Israel, but the principle applies to every nation. America is declining because of her growing independence of God. Where is her faith?
