Mr. Ricky "Railroad Rick" Daughtery of the Watervale Community on Lebanon Highway was pronounced dead on arrival at 7:30 p.m. Thursday evening, June 5, 2008 at Riverview Regional Medical Center in Carthage. The 41 year old was involved in a single car accident which was reported to Smith County E-911 at 6:25 p.m. from 404 Lebanon Highway.

Monday afternoon funeral services were conducted by his pastor, Eld. James "Pee Wee" Massey at 1 p.m. from the Carthage Chapel of Sanderson Funeral Home. Burial followed in the Cedar Grove Cemetery in Lebanon.

The son of the late Casey Daughtery and Brenda Dishman Daughtery, he was born in the Shop Springs Community of Wilson County on June 23, 1966.
