



Macon County traveled to Hendersonville on December 4th and hosted Gordonsville on December 7th. The Tigers split their games and the Tigerettes grabbed two more wins.

The MCHS Tigerettes came ready to play the Lady Commanders. In the opening period four of the five starters scored and Kailyn Brooks got 6 of her game high 21 points. Cold shooting by Hendersonville and solid defense by the Tigerettes staked them to a 29-17 halftime lead.

The second half saw more of the same. Timely three pointers by Brooks, Terra Pryor, and Briley Driver kept the lead at 10 after three, 44-34. Coach Beam was able to get everyone into the game and coast to a 61-46 victory.
